## Field trip gives Phi Alpha Theta honor society up-close look at history

On Friday, Oct. 17, Texas Wesleyan's chapter of Phi Alpha Theta (PAT) sponsored a field trip to view the National Geographic film *Jerusalem* at the Fort Worth Museum of Science and History's IMAX Theater. The topic is particularly important to history majors as Jerusalem has figured prominently in multiple eras of world history such as the rise of civilization in the ancient Near East, Hebrew history, the advent of both Christianity and Islam and the Crusades, and is often consider the apex of some of the most important issues affecting the modern Middle East.



The film chronicles the history of the city from multiple perspectives and attempts to explain how and why Jerusalem became the crossroads of civilization. It accomplishes this using the larger-than-life IMAX technology, serving to virtually transport the viewer to some of the city's most famous sites: the Church of the Holy Sepulchre, the Dome of the Rock and Al-Aqsa mosques, and the Western or "Wailing" Wall.
